Students majoring in Secondary Education or K-12 Art, Music, or Physical Education may complete this endorsement in addition to their first content endorsement area.

Students must earn a minimum 3.0 GPA in courses required for the major and each endorsement. The grade of B or above must be earned in designated education major pre-admission and major courses, and students must earn a grade of C or above in all other courses required for the major pre-admission courses, major, and each endorsement.
