Coursework prepares the student with skills, knowledge, and competencies in individual, family, and group counseling assessment and intervention; and understanding of general, special, and gifted and talented education principles. The student will complete the practicum education experience in a school or Area Education Agency setting. Coursework in this specialty fulfills requirements of the Iowa Department of Education for educational endorsement #240-School Social Worker and is completed through a collaboration with the Grand View Master of Education program.
