



FINANCIAL AID 2024-2025

When you invest in a Grand View education, you are investing a substantial amount of energy, time and money in yourself and your future. We invite you to compare our value to the other options you are considering. Grand View is committed to making a private education available to all students, regardless of financial standing.

We'll help you and your family consider all the financial aid options, so you can best plan your investment. In 2022-23, more than 99% of our full-time day students receive financial assistance. The average financial aid package for new freshmen exceeds \$31,523, with more than \$26,386 in scholarships and grants and the remainder in work-study and loans.

To be considered for Financial Assistance:

- Apply and be accepted to Grand View.
- Be degree-seeking.
- File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.studentaid.gov as soon as possible when available in December 2023. Enter GV's school code **001867** in Step Six of the FAFSA.

GRAND VIEW ASSISTANCE

Alumni Scholarship \$1,000, four-year

Eligibility: New full-time first-year or transfer students whose parent(s) received either an associate, bachelor's or master's degree at Grand View

Art Department Scholarship \$500 – \$2,000, renewable

Eligibility: New full-time day students who demonstrate talent in art and major in Game Design, Graphic Design, Graphic Journalism, Art Education or Studio Arts and participate in art portfolio reviews in November and February

Athletic Scholarship Begin at \$500

Eligibility: Based on athletic ability as evaluated by the coach

Philip L. Hougen Campus Ministries Scholarship \$500 – \$1,500

Eligibility: Selected applicants from Lutheran congregations who express intention to participate regularly in Grand View campus ministry

Deadline: March 1, 2024

Discover Iowa Award \$1,000

Offered to new first-year students from out of state who visit campus through an individual admissions visit or admissions event.

GRAND VIEW AWARDS

Grand View academic and need-based scholarships are renewable scholarships available to new full-time day students. To qualify, students must meet specific academic requirements, apply and be accepted to Grand View. Amounts are based on living on campus and will be reduced by \$2,000 for students who commute. Students who do not live on campus are limited to no more than \$22,500 in GV grants and scholarships.

FIRST-YEAR AWARDS

You may be invited to compete for additional scholarship awards at Scholarship Days.

<i>Compete for at least one full-tuition scholarship and multiple \$5,000 scholarships at each Scholarship Day.</i>	

Dean's Scholarship	\$18,000
<i>Compete for at least one additional \$3,000 scholarship at each Scholarship Day.</i>	

Director's Award	\$16,000
<i>Compete for at least one additional \$2,000 scholarship at each Scholarship Day.</i>	

GV Scholar's Award	\$14,000
<i>Compete for at least one additional \$2,000 scholarship at each Scholarship Day.</i>	

All non-winning students attending a Scholarship Day will receive an additional \$1,000 scholarship award.

Grand View Grant	\$12,000
<i>Available to first-time, full-time freshmen who do not qualify for above scholarships.</i>	

TRANSFER AWARDS

Renewability is based on the number of transfer credits accepted and cumulative GPA at Grand View. There is not a special application for the Presidential, Dean's, Director's and GV Scholar's Awards, or Grand View Grant. Amounts are based on living on campus and will be reduced by \$2,000 for students who commute.

To qualify, a student must be admitted as an undergraduate full-time day transfer student, be an active member of a community college chapter and submit a Phi Theta Kappa scholarship application. Deadline for consideration is August 1 for fall semester and January 1 for spring semester. A limited number of awards are offered.

Outstanding Community College Transfer Scholarships

A \$1,500 renewable scholarship awarded each year (maximum of three years) to new full-time day students who transfer to Grand View directly from an accredited community college/junior college/two-year institution. To qualify, students must transfer a cumulative GPA of 3.0 and a minimum of 45 semester hours, complete an Outstanding Community College Transfer Scholarship application, provide two written references, including one academic, and submit recorded service to the community or college. Deadline for consideration is May 1 for fall semester and December 1 for spring semester. A limited number of awards are offered.

Students returning to Grand View from any leave of absence will be eligible to resume the scholarship or grant awards they qualified for when they began their leave assuming all qualification criteria are still met.

GRAND VIEW ASSISTANCE, CONTINUED

Grand View Honors Scholarship \$5,000

Eligibility: First-year students who have a 3.91 or higher high school GPA and who participate in the Honors Program may compete for a four-year renewable scholarship. Must be admitted to Grand View and attend a Scholarship Day event.

Immigrant Iowan Scholarship Full tuition and room charges if the recipient lives on campus, plus the following fees: technology, student activity and resident activity fees. **Eligibility:** Student or his/her parents was born outside the United States, student is not in the country on a student visa and is graduating from an Iowa high school with a 3.0 GPA or higher. **Deadline:** March 1, 2024

Lutheran Music Program Scholarship \$1,000

Eligibility: Alumni of the Lutheran Music Program (Lutheran Summer Music) and majoring in music, music education or church music. Recipients may also audition for an additional Musical Arts Scholarship.

Nursing Honors Scholarship \$5,000

Eligibility: First-year students who have a 3.91 or higher high school GPA and an interest in nursing may compete for a four-year renewable scholarship. Must be admitted to Grand View and attend a Scholarship Day event.

Musical Arts Scholarship \$500 – \$4,000

Eligibility: Full-time day student demonstrating talent in piano, vocal and instrumental music regardless of major. Auditions are conducted in November, January and February.

STEM Honors Scholarship \$5,000

Eligibility: First-year students who have a 3.91 or higher high school GPA and an interest in one of GV's science, technology, pre-engineering, or math (STEM) programs may compete for a four-year renewable scholarship. **Deadline:** March 1, 2024

Theatre Department Scholarship \$300 – \$4,000

Eligibility: Full-time day students majoring or minoring in Theatre with an interest in participating in theatre productions. Scholarship interviews will be conducted in November, January and February.

MATCHING SCHOLARSHIPS

Education Partners in Covenant (EPIC) A renewable, matching scholarship up to \$500 per year, awarded to full-time students who are members of Lutheran congregations and have received awards from those congregations.

Dollars for Scholars Grand View matches up to \$500.

STATE OF IOWA ASSISTANCE

Iowa Tuition Grant A grant based on financial need with a typical maximum award of \$7,500 in the 2023-2024 school year, awarded to students up to a maximum of four years. To qualify, you must be a resident of Iowa, a United States citizen or residing in the United States on a permanent visa, currently enrolled or planning to enroll in an undergraduate program at an Iowa private college, and you must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) annually before July 1.

FEDERAL ASSISTANCE

Federal Pell Grant A grant based on exceptional financial need. This grant varies, with a maximum of \$7,395 in the 2023-2024 school year.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG) A grant up to \$500 awarded to students who demonstrate exceptional financial need. To qualify, you must submit the FAFSA annually by the March 1 priority deadline.

Federal Work Study A work opportunity up to \$1,500 awarded to students who demonstrate financial need.

Federal Direct Subsidized Stafford Loan A loan up to \$3,500 as a freshman, \$4,500 as a sophomore and \$5,500 as a junior or senior, awarded to students who demonstrate financial need. To qualify, you must submit the FAFSA annually. This loan is interest-free while the student is in school. Repayment begins six months after graduation or when a student ceases to attend at least half-time. The interest rate is fixed at 5.49% for loans disbursed after July 1, 2023.

Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan A loan awarded to students regardless of financial need. To qualify, you must submit the FAFSA annually. This loan's interest accumulates while you are in school and the interest rate is fixed at 5.49% for loans disbursed after July 1, 2023. Each undergraduate student is eligible for a \$2,000 Unsubsidized Stafford Loan. Repayment begins six months after graduation or when a student ceases to attend at least half-time.

Federal Direct Parent Plus Loan A loan made to parents of the student regardless of financial need. This loan varies based on cost of education and other financial aid received. Typically, repayment begins immediately upon disbursement of loan funds. Deferment options are available. The interest rate is fixed at 8.05% for loans disbursed after July 1, 2023.

PAYMENT PLANS

The GV Payment Plan option allows students to divide the total amount due from the billing statement into three, four, five or six installments per semester. Access to these payment plans is available through www.grandview.edu.

PRIVATE LOANS

Grand View offers a preferred lender list called FASTChoice to assist students and parents who wish to borrow private student or parent loans to fund their education. The lenders and loan options present in FASTChoice were selected for their excellent terms and benefits they provide to borrowers.
