

# Secondary Endorsement All Social Sciences 5-12

Students majoring in Secondary Education must complete the prescribed pre-education requirements, the requirements for the Secondary Education major, and at least one content endorsement. This endorsement can be completed as the student's <u>first content endorsement</u>.

Students must earn a minimum 3.0 GPA in courses required for the major and each endorsement. The grade of B or above must be earned in designated education major pre-admission and major courses, and students must earn a grade of C or above in all other courses required for the major pre-admission courses, major, and each endorsement. ## Iowa Teaching Endorsement: #186

**Requirements for the Endorsement:** 2 credits of methods coursework plus 52 credits of content area coursework. Those already licensed in Social Sciences may be required to complete a practicum depending on their initial license; inquire with the Education Department Chair.

Note: Students may complete the History major by taking two more upper-division courses in American and World history respectively. See the History major checklist. Those students truly wishing to teach Psychology in high school should additionally take PSYC 325 Counseling Theories.
