



Elementary Endorsement Social Sciences K-8

Students majoring in Elementary Education must complete the prescribed pre-education requirements, the requirements for the Elementary Education major, and at least one content endorsement. The Elementary Education major includes the requirements for the Elementary Education endorsement, so this additional elementary endorsement assumes its completion.

Students must earn a minimum 3.0 GPA in courses required for the major and each endorsement. The grade of B or above must be earned in designated education major pre-admission and major courses, and students must earn a grade of C or above in all other courses required for the major pre-admission courses, major, and each endorsement.
