



## Secondary Endorsement World History 5-12

Students majoring in Secondary Education must complete the prescribed pre-education requirements, the requirements for the Secondary Education major, and at least one content endorsement. This endorsement can be combined with another social sciences endorsement to be submitted as the student's first content endorsement.

Students must earn a minimum 3.0 GPA in courses required for the major and each endorsement. The grade of B or above must be earned in designated education major pre-admission and major courses, and students must earn a grade of C or above in all other courses required for the major pre-admission courses, major, and each endorsement. Please see the university catalog for additional information.

Note: The endorsements of American History (#158) and World History (#166) are embedded within a double major in Secondary Education and History. The faculty of both the Education and History departments strongly advise the additional completion of the All Social Sciences endorsement (#186).

### Iowa Teaching Endorsement: #166

**Requirements for the Endorsement:** Methods coursework plus either 15 credits content area coursework if pursuing licensure as a Social Sciences teacher or 30 credits if not pursuing licensure as a Social Sciences teacher. It is recommended you complete 30 credits by completing 15 credits in two social sciences.
