Requirements for the Major: 42 credits

The Liberal Arts Major affords students the opportunity to gain familiarity with and appreciation for a broad spectrum of academic disciplines. Students who prefer a more focused program of study or who may be preparing for graduate school have the flexibility to emphasize areas present in the general education core. All students are expected to consult with the faculty advisors in developing their programs of study.

Requirements for the Major:

42 semester credits with a total of at least 24 upper division hours earned in this major. Courses taken as part of the skill building component of the General Education Core (i.e., composition and quantitative reasoning requirements) may not be counted toward the hours required for the major. All courses taken for the major will be counted in computing the 2.2 GPA required for the major. LIBA 300 and LIBA 450 must be included as part of the major course work.
