

VERIFICATION WORKSHEET 2021-2022

Your 2021-22 FAFSA was selected for review in a process called "verification." WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

- Be sure to fill out sections A-D of this worksheet completely, including all Parent sections if you are a dependent student.
- If you (and/or your parent(s) if you are a dependent student) filed a 2019 tax return with the IRS and did NOT use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool on your FAFSA, you will need to do one of the following two options:
 - Log into your FAFSA, select "Make FAFSA Corrections" and navigate to the Financial Information section. From there, follow the instructions to determine if you/your parent(s) are eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2019 IRS information to your FAFSA (recommended).
 - If you are unable or choose not to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool for your FAFSA, you (and your parent(s) if you are dependent) are required to submit a 2019 IRS Tax Return Transcript to our office. This form can be ordered at www.IRS.gov or by calling 1-800-908-9946. You will need to provide your Social Security #, date of birth, and address on file with the IRS.
