



## The NEXUS Institute "What Now" 2023 Recap

The NEXUS Institute recently wrapped up it's 2023 week of focusing on "What Now?" Jesus died, was buried, and rose again. Disciples then (and now) ask, "What Now?" We had daily themes from Matthew chapter 28 of "Do Not Be Afraid," "Go and Tell," "Jesus Has All Authority," "Go and Make Disciples," and "I Am With You." Read more to check out what we did!

This summer's institute, generously sponsored by the North American Lutheran Church (NALC) brought youth for a week of on-campus learning and growing in faith and calling, and a fantastic experience of intentional Christian community with each other and their college mentors. We had 15 students participate, coming to us from seven states and Canada. We had eight college-age mentors, five of which are Grand View students.

Our first theology class, taught by the Rev. Dr. Mark Mattes and sponsored by Lutheran Bible Institute, focused on the book of Jeremiah. Our second class, taught by the Rev. Dr. Ken Jones and sponsored by 1517, consisted of lessons revolving around Paul's letters to the early Church. Evening Ministry Labs focused on engaging others in conversation, cherishing and leaning into our church families, discernment (general and specific to vocational ministry), sacred pathways of connecting and feeling close to God, and p(r)aying attention.

Each afternoon, we focused on community fellowship by going on adventures in the area. This summer, we enjoyed Game-a-palooza on campus (4-square in the air was a hit!), the Des Moines Art Center, a pool day, Jordan Creek Mall, and Adventureland. Participants enjoyed riding Hope+Elim Church's school bus (while singing at the top of their lungs) and seeing more of the area.

NEXUS Late Night, our talk show where those who work or have worked in vocational ministry are interviewed, was a hit again this year! This summer's guests were Jeff Morlock (Pastor, Dir. Of Vocational Discernment at the North American Lutheran Seminary), Kate Faas (NEXUS Director), Luke Ratke and Ethan Zimmerman (current NEXUS mentors and seminarians), Teresa Peters (Pastor, Dir. Of Youth and

Family for the NALC), Bob Speirs (Pastor), and Dr. Rachelle Keck (Grand View's new president). Participants got to ask questions of each interviewee, and contact information was provided to the many participants who desired further conversations with our passionate and exemplar visitors.

One of our joys at NEXUS is to faithfully worship first thing in the morning and as the last thing at night. Both services took place in Luther Memorial Church's beautiful sanctuary. Each included a call to worship, prayer, singing, and a message. Morning worship featured talented piano players and hymns, and evening worship was led by Levi Faas and a band of musicians and included Communion in a more contemporary style. Mentors started off assisting in leading portions of worship, and the high school participants enthusiastically stepped up in those leading roles the rest of the week.

Each college mentor had 2-3 participants as their mentees for the week, encouraging them and helping them navigate the week. Small group time happened in the morning after classes and again in the evening, with groups spreading out around the church and campus to discuss class topics and whatever else came up naturally. This year we continued to incorporate beginning evening small groups with the St. Ignatius' Daily Examen, a time of quieting oneself, reflecting on one's day, and listening for the still, small voice of the Lord. There was a lot of laughter, many in-depth conversations, stories shared and heard, and a few tears shed through small group time. It was a blessing to see the students bonding, sharing, pointing each other to Jesus, and praying for each other.
