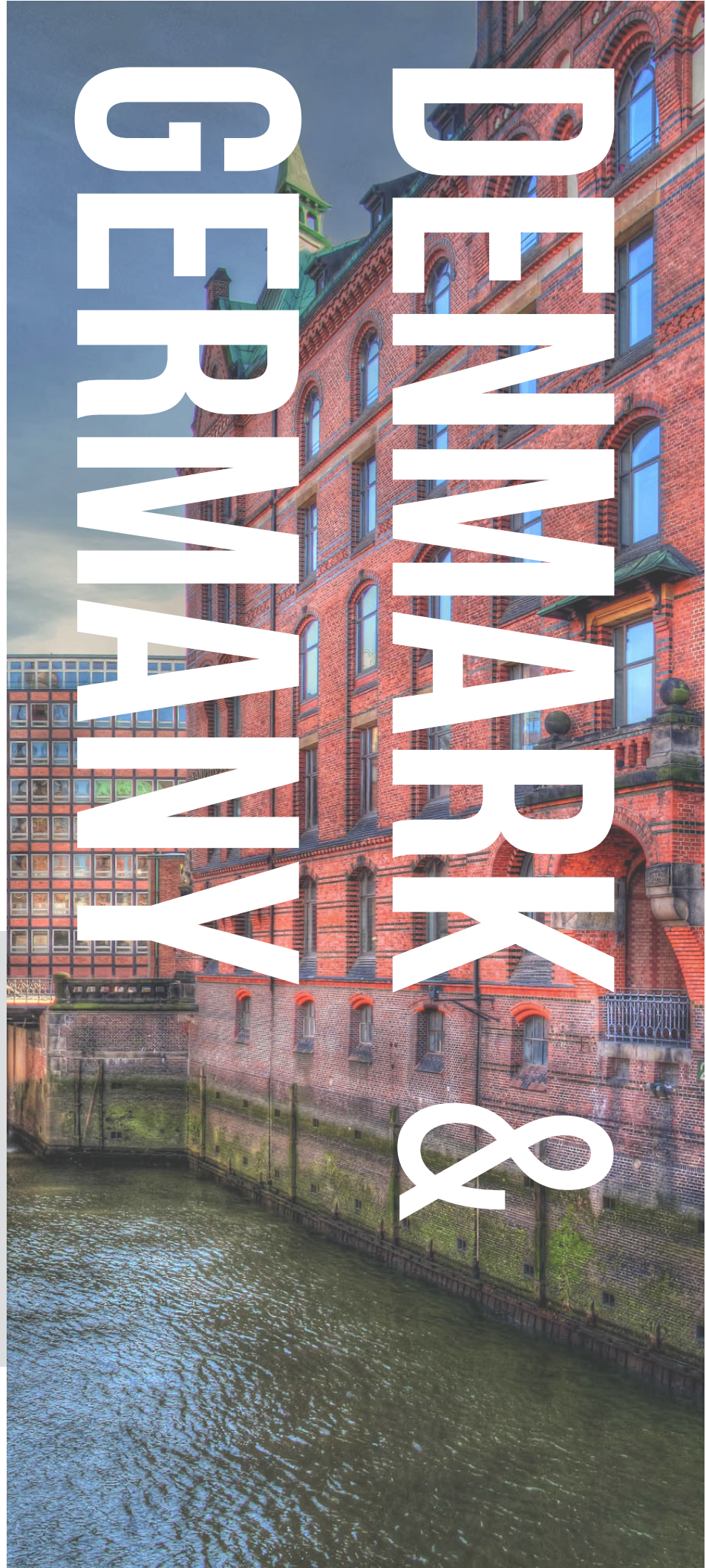

HEALTH & SOCIAL ISSUES

Join us for a study tour to learn how the United States, Denmark, and Germany respond to providing health and social services to their citizens and marginalized populations. • Use knowledge to influence stateside social programs and policies • Develop an appreciation and clearer understanding of self, one's career, and society by engaging in caring relationships with members of a different culture • Understand Danish culture beyond one's own country, ultimately leading to advocacy for self and others.

COURSES

Core Seminar II (LIBA 300) or Social Problems (SOCS 315)

Students may enroll in either LIBA 300 or SOCS 315 and earn the iterations (CI, IL, Q, GA, W) associated with both courses as the outcomes for each will be combined for this study tour section. Students will gain a deeper understanding of major social problems in the U.S. and compare how the issues are addressed in Denmark and Germany. Areas of consideration include crime and delinquency, minority groups and prejudice, homelessness, mental and physical health, substance abuse, deviant behavior, urbanization, the family, sex-role conflicts, and environmental issues. Students will wrestle with difference, bias, and perspective through an immersion within the local and global community.

Core Seminar III (LIBA 450) Understanding Your Purpose: The Adventure With Others

Students will explore the multi-faceted ways they are called to lead lives of ethical service to others. They will reflect upon their personal and academic preparation for such a life and articulate a personal statement of calling. Students will pose and answer for themselves questions about their academic preparation, vocational discernment and ethical commitment. They will reflect on past experiences and articulate a statement of vocation as they prepare to begin their post-university life. The experiences of the study tour will provide particular opportunities for this reflection on vocation, as we will see how different societies face issues of social responsibility to marginalized populations, and consider our own responsibilities towards others in the process.
